<u>Math</u>

- We continued working on decomposing (or taking apart) numbers. You start with the whole group and then break it into two groups. For example, if you start with a whole group of 4 bears, you could break it into 2 smaller parts, like 2 and 2 or 4 and 1.
- Our math center activities gave everyone the opportunity to practice composing numbers, comparing amounts, number order, counting with correspondence, writing numbers, and showing amounts on a 10-frame.

Our Other Activities

- Our literacy center activities gave everyone the opportunity to practice identifying letters & their sounds, identifying heart words, breaking down words into syllables, and rhyming.
- During social studies group, we worked on creating a classroom map with a map key.
- We learned a little bit about Kwanzaa.


