KINDERGARTEN NEWS Week of April 29th

<u>Math</u>

- We began a new chapter on shapes. We learned that shapes like a circle and a square are called flat shapes or 2-dimensional shapes. Each 2D shape has a certain number of sides and vertices.
- Our math center activities gave everyone an opportunity to practice comparing length, adding, subtracting, comparing amounts, identifying 2D shapes, and counting amounts shown in base-10 formation.

Our Other Learning Activities

- Our literacy center activities gave everyone an opportunity to reading heart words/high frequency words, making & reading CVC words, identifying the digraph in a given word, and identifying if a letter sounds is at the beginning or end of the word.
- During science group, we learned about living vs. nonliving things. Living things grow, take in nutrients (water & food) and reproduce (ex. animals give birth to more animals and plants create seeds to grow more plants). We took a walk around the edge of the playground to find examples of living and nonliving things. We also talked about a plant's life cycle & what plants need to survive, and planted grass.
- We got together with our buddies to play games and to decorate our white t-shirts. Don't forget to wear your buddy shirt on our field trip Friday!




