Math - We continued working on developing number sense. This week we learned how to write 8-10 and practiced writing 1-10. (Sometimes writing numbers can be tricky. Practicing this at home would be helpful.) I have listed the little sayings I use for writing each new number below.

8 - make an S \& close the gate...that's the way you make an eight
9- a circle and a line, make a number nine
IO - number ten is a hero...first a one and then a zero
Our math center activities focused on writing numbers, counting with correspondence, and matching numbers to their quantities. We also worked on showing amounts on a 10-frame.
